## Reflection

What might it mean to be filled with the spirit of Wisdom? To feed on the living bread and have eternal life? To be filled indeed with the whole fullness of God? Something to be sure to be hoped for, glimpsed, experienced a little perhaps, not to be put into words.

Most of us here are trans people. Many of us have lived divided, compartmentalised, broken lives. It may have been a struggle not so much to be filled with the fulness of God but simply to know and be our whole selves, complete and undivided. Our journey of self-knowledge can be a long one, with many detours and false trails. Even at the end of it, some of us might feel that that very self is actually a divided self, that it includes both a masculine and feminine identity. Integrating these different parts of ourselves or undoing the emotional harm of long years of repression can be very challenging. Sometimes our churches can feel more like part of the problem than the solution.

Perhaps some of us continue to live defeated lives because we have never fully come to terms with who we are. The self we live in is fragile, fragmented, easily hurt, immature, ego-driven. It's not easy even for God to work with such a self. And if we prefer to keep on living in the security and comfort of that immature, incomplete self, despite all the pain and trauma that comes with it, if we don't accept the risk of change and find a way to transmute and transform our pain we shall most certainly transmit it to others.

The Bible from start to finish is full of stories of liberation, freedom from bondage and from false kinds of security. Adam and Eve were driven out of the safety and security of their garden. The Israelites in the desert complained that at least when they were slaves back in Egypt they had food to eat and a roof over their heads. Jesus constantly reminded his hearers of the cost of discipleship, of what they had to lose, of the need for profound interior change. The need in fact to be "born again" – a phrase with huge resonance for many trans people.

Our self-knowledge can indeed sometimes be very hard won. Some of us might have preferred to stick for a very long time with the safe and familiar, living inauthentic lives for the sake of status and security. But God, as the psalm Grace read to us tells us, has always known us as we truly are and has been with us every step of the way. Once we have taken that momentous step of self-acceptance – or rather committed ourselves to that process - we might see that what we have lost is far outweighed by our gains. Though birth is often a painful and difficult experience.

For some time after I transitioned I thought I had made a mistake. Some of the challenges seemed impossibly hard. I worried a lot. I couldn't sleep. In some ways it was a leap into the dark, an act of faith that things would get better. And they did. I heard one Sibyl say that after her transition God became her lover. In this way we can see that the trans experience, the emergence of the true self from the false self, entirely mirrors and replicates the pattern of death and re-birth that must characterise every life modelled on Christ. We can perhaps begin to grasp a little of the breadth and the length, the height and the depth of the love of God.

For we are not divided within ourselves as far as God is concerned. What Jesus is by nature, we are by grace, a fusion of the divine and the human. Surely the sanctification we are all called to involves the full acceptance of our own nature both as trans or non-binary people and as beings inhabited by and united to the indwelling presence of God. That God who feeds us with the living bread that has come down from heaven. The God who will raise us up on the last day. The God through whom our lives are no longer defeated but whole, blessed and fruitful, lives available to God, lives that God can work with, lives one day to be filled with the whole fullness of God.
