## The Chalcedon Formula AD451

### (Stressing the unity of Deity and Humanity in Jesus)

THEREFORE, following the holy fathers, we all with one accord teach men to acknowledge one and the same Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, at once complete in Godhead and complete in manhood. truly God and truly man, consisting also of a reasonable soul and body. of one substance with the Father as regards his Godhead, and at the same time of one substance with us as regards his manhood. like us in all respects, apart from sin. as regards his Godhead, begotten of the Father before the ages, but yet as regards his manhood begotten, for us men and for our salvation, of Mary the Virgin, the God bearer. one and the same Christ, Son, Lord, Only begotten, recognized in two natures, without confusion, without change, without division, without separation. the distinction of nature's being in no way annulled by the union, but rather the characteristics of each nature being preserved and coming together to form one person and subsistence, not as parted or separated into two persons, but one and the same Son and Only begotten God the Word, Lord Jesus Christ. even as the prophets from earliest times spoke of him, and our Lord Jesus Christ himself taught us, and the creed of the fathers has handed down to us.

2 (For the life was manifested, and we have seen it, and bear witness, and show unto you that eternal life, which was with the Father, and was manifested to us)

3 That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that you also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ. 4 And these things write we unto you, that your joy may be full.

As an addition to our praise let us say together the following rainbow meditation (which I wrote during a time of great difficulty in January 1984).

<u>White</u> is for God's purity His freedom from sin (Mark 9:3) <u>Red</u> is for Christ's blood Shed freely to save <u>Orange</u> is for God's anger Glowing hot, like burning coals <u>Yellow</u> is for God's light Giving us truth <u>Green</u> is for God's creativity Abundant in its lush fertility

<u>Blue</u> is for God's mystery Deep and unfathomable <u>Purple</u> is for God's royalty One King and Lord of all (Genesis 9:8-17)

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit – as it was in the beginning, so shall it be, world without end, Amen (Revelation 21:1-7).

#### Third Reading From John 8:54f. (Stressing the Deity of Jesus)

54 Jesus answered, If I honour myself, my honour is nothing: it is my Father that honours me; of whom you say, that he is your God

55 Yet you have not known him; but I know him: and if I should say, I know him not, I shall be a liar to you: but I know him and keep his saying.

56 Your father Abraham rejoiced to see my day: and he saw it and was glad.

57 Then said the Jews to him, 'You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?'

58 Jesus said to them, Verily, verily, 'I say to you, Before Abraham was, I am.'

# THE MYSTERIOUS UNION

### (How The Two Natures of Jesus Can Bless Trans Christians

### Part 1: A Doctrinal Gold Standard

In Christian Theology, the mysterious union between perfect deity and perfect humanity in Jesus is known as the 'Hypostatic union' or 'personal union' (which will be the term that shall be used in these reflections). Very simply it refers to the way two natures exist in one person, 'without confusion, without change, without division, without separation. the distinction of nature's being in no way annulled by the union,' This means, 'our Lord Jesus Christ, [is] at once complete in Godhead and complete in manhood, truly God and truly man,' You will rightly conclude that the Christ proclaimed in the Chalcedon Declaration following much theological controversy, is the one I follow. This is because I believe that it represent an adequate, if not exhaustive summary of scriptural teaching concerning our Lord's nature. Nonetheless. we are faced with the question as to 'how perfect deity and perfect humanity is able to co-existing in just one person?'

Theologians have deeply pondered this question. Part of the answer lies in the fact that divinity has the capacity to encompass humanity without diminishing it. Indeed, as we come under progressively greater divine influence our humanity is enhanced. The real problem is not between God and our human nature. Which after all, is a Creation of His – rather it is between God and the sin that has engulfed that nature. There is the added fact that in his love God will gladly restrain the more visible manifestation of His deity in order to allow the human to express itself. On the cross, Jesus could have called a whole legion of angels to rescue him, but He didn't. Calvary was a case of deity restrained rather than deity lost. This was because <u>God himself wanted to experience the worst of human suffering</u>. Think on that, our Creator who flung billions of galaxies into space reduced Himself to being a tortured, murder victim on the cross. If that doesn't fill you with awe I don't know what will.

The belief, that as eternal God, the second person of the divine trinity was so motivated by love that He descended to become a sinless human being in order to offer a perfect non-repeatable sacrifice for our sins and those of the world (1 John 2:2) represents the Gold Standard in

**Christian teaching.** Without this belief, it's hard to see that what remains is in any way authentically biblical. All that is offered is a mangled Christ who's useless for our salvation. If Christ weren't divine to worship Him would be idolatry; if Christ weren't also human how can God identify with our afflictions? Moreover, if He didn't offer a complete non-repeatable sacrifice to atone *i.e.* cover over our sin what use was his ministry? The effect of such denials would at best, be to reduce Christ to being just one good teacher among many good teachers. His uniqueness would be denied. The reality is that <u>Christ's work as a divine-human saviour is clearly bound-up with what He accomplished in His work of procuring our redemption and forgiveness of sin.</u> Only a being with Christ's dual nature would have the capacity to deal with or sins and the sins of the world. This was a point implicit in the Chalcedon formula. The fourth century Church Father Athanasius (c.297-373AD) the five times exiled Bishop of Alexandria in Egypt recognized this point very clearly in his struggle against Arius who wrongly taught *'there was a time when Christ was not.'* Athanasius' treatise on the Incarnation is a masterpiece and well worth reading.

### Part 2: A Threefold Blessing

All this is very well, but 'how does this mysterious union between deity and humanity in Christ bless trans people?' Is it just a piece of esoteric theology with little relevance to our daily lives or does it represent a divinely revealed truth that have the potential to change our lives and help us navigate the horrendous complexities of being Trans. Obviously, I believe the latter for who Jesus is can strongly influence who we are as Trans people. It can also influence our actions and relationship with others. Present is a threefold blessing.

In his Deity, Christ enables us to gain access to spiritual resources not available to those outside the faith. Being God means He knows everything about us. Moreover, He also knows exactly what we need (which may or may not be what we want). He can also bestow God's Holy Spirit who will generously give us the strength and wisdom needed to handle being Trans. Through being immersed in His Holy Spirit we can receive that incredible love that enables us to go out into the world and be a blessing to others. (A reading of 1 Corinthians 13 will show what that love consists of.) Through faith in Christ we can enjoy a personal '1-thou' relationship with our maker. We must remember that Christianity is relational as well as doctrinal. The closer we come to God the more we can appreciate the teachings scripture give about Christ, On a cautionary note, it's worth remarking that a seriously deficient view of Christ if wilfully maintained over a long time period may well be a sign of a deficient relationship with him. A reading of Church History would suggest that militantly held mistaken views of Christ can be a sign of underlying spiritual problems. Almost constantly the real identity of our saviour is under some form of attack from both within the world and from within the Church. All too often it is either ignored, mocked, obscured or overtly denied by those wishing to pursue a Christ of their own imagination. As one Vicar once remarked in a sermon I heard during the 1980s, undermining the identity of Christ appears to be one of the devils main obsessions. He hates the reality of who Jesus is. The ferocious Christological dispute of the fourth and fifth centuries would be enough confirm this point. As the Church fathers well knew, these battles were a manifestation of a ferocious conflict in the spiritual realm.

In his Humanity, comfort can be drawn from the way Christ has been tested in all the ways we have. This means what we've suffered He also suffered; what we endure in terms of personal rejection He endured; the many temptations that beset us also beset Him. Christ was no mere bystander casually observing our sufferings from afar He actually went through them Himself. One only has to read Isaiah 52:13-53:1f to see this. During His time on earth He knew what it was like to feel utterly forsaken by God, (Matthew 27:46). If Christ's deity represents the end of a bridge that linking us to God; then His Humanity remains the end of the bridge linking God to us.

In his personal union between deity and humanity, Jesus showed us the way to inner integration. and wholeness. This means the more we allow His Spirit to fill us the more we become the people we were meant to be. Following over five decades of struggle (from 1964 until 2021) I eventually concluded that if Christ could hold together two natures then why shouldn't His all-powerful Spirit enable me to hold together the male and female inside of me? The key was to be open to that Spirit and to be willing follow His leadings once they have been clearly discerned. By *'walking in the* Spirit' (Galatians 5:16)

and by surrendering everything to Christ the mentally excruciating conflict between the male and female within me finally ended whilst on a private retreat January 2021 (although it had begun to ebb from July the previous year). These aspects of my personality are still there, and they are still distinct but now they are partners rather than warring members trying to destroy each other. Where there was once confusion, conflict and shame there is now clarity. peace and joy. Under God's amazing grace there has been a marriage between the male and female within me. What has transpired has been one of the most incredible miracles of my life. It has also led to the development of some precious friendships. If you wish to receive the blessings outlined here, all I can do is urge you to come to the Christ revealed in God's Holy Word. Place you trust in Him, give Him your undivided allegiance and surrender every area of your life to Him. Do this willingly and He won't turn you away.

In the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and our God, who as the Word made Flesh came to die for our sins, before rising from the dead three days later and ascending into Heaven from where He will come again in glory. Amen.

Having just presented who Jesus is the next step is to have a time when we are relating to him through prayer. But let us first briefly pause to reflect on what has been said.

# PRAYER

Be encouraged by the promise of Hebrews 4:14-16 which stresses the humanity of Jesus "Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession. For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." Let us now pray as the Spirit leads.

Let us be confident that in his full deity and humanity Jesus will now graciously hear the prayers that we shall make.
